The Horace Mann Senior High School Transitional Class of 1972 has a goal to award up to \$10,000 in scholarships this year to deserving high school students as a part of its efforts to encourage students to seek higher education.

Eligibility for Scholarship

1. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior of **African American descent** enrolled in the Little Rock Public School District.
2. The applicant must have a grade point average of **2.75 or above**.
3. An official transcript (mailed directly from the registrar’s office of the applicant’s high school) is required.
4. The applicant must be enrolled in a college, university, or vocational school at the time the scholarship is awarded. If the scholarship recipient does not enter a college, university, or vocational school, the scholarship will be automatically forfeited. An acceptance letter from the school must be submitted. A copy of the acceptance letter must be included before the scholarship being awarded.
5. The scholarship is awarded directly to the recipient.
6. The postmark deadline for the scholarship application is **Friday, April 28, 2023**. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Please attach a recent **photo**, which is non-returnable. By submitting the photo with your application, you give permission for the photo to be used in HMTc72 promotional media.
7. Scholarship award applicants will be required to address the Scholarship Review Committee in an oral interview on **Friday, May 12, 2023**. Individual appointments to be determined.
8. **The date of the award presentation is June 11, 2023. The time is TBD. If you are chosen to receive the scholarship, you will need to be there at this event. If you are unable to attend, the scholarship will be forfeited.**
9. *****The application must be typed. No handwritten applications will be accepted.*****
10. **Failure to adhere to the above-listed rules and regulations automatically will disqualify an applicant.**

Each applicant is required to complete a typed essay on the topic: “The importance in pursuing higher education in achieving career goals.”
