Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is, "Why is the Veteran Important?"

Big Future Scholarships - \$40,000 - 24 Awards (Deadline: October 31, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be a senior in high school.
- B) Be attending college or university no later than Fall 2023.

Coca-Cola Scholars Program - \$20,000 - 150 Awards (Deadline: October 31, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be a current high school student who will graduate during the 2022-2023 year.
- B) Be a U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent Residents, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees - based on the guidelines utilized by U.S. Department of Education.

Voice of Democracy Scholarship - \$35,000 – 50 Awards (Deadline: October 31, 2022)

Regeneron Science Talent Search - \$250,000 - 300 Awards (Deadline: November 9, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be in their final year of high school.
- B) Submit original research in a critically important scientific field of study.

10 Words or Less Scholarship - \$1,000 - 1 Award (Deadline: November 15, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be between the ages of 14-25 who will be attending school in the Fall of 2023.
- B) Submit a response to the sponsor’s essay prompt.

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be a high school student planning to attend college in September 2023.

Dell Scholars Program - \$20,000 - 300 Awards (Deadline: December 1, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Participate in a program-approved college readiness program in grades 11 and 12 and demonstrate financial need.
- B) Be on track to graduate from an accredited high school in the current academic year.

Barbara Lotze Scholarships for Future Teachers - \$3,000 - 6 Awards (Deadline: December 1, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be a high school senior accepted for enrollment in 2023 who plans to pursue a course of study leading toward a career in teaching physics in high school.

Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow Scholarship - \$6,000 - 1 Award (Deadline: December 1, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be a current USBC Youth member in their senior year of high school or enrolled in college.
- B) Have a current GPA of 3.0 or better, based on a 4.0 scale.

American Rocketry Challenge - \$20,000 – 10 Awards (Deadline: December 1, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be part of a team of three to ten students in Grade 6-12.
- B) Build a model rocket that carries one large hen egg to an altitude of 850 feet, stays airborne for between 42 and 45 seconds, and returns the rocket to the ground safely.

Mindscape Big Picture Scholarship - \$10,000 - 1 Award (Deadline: December 15, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Have a deep curiosity in studying the universe for its own sake, whether that be pursuing studies in philosophy, biology, math, literature, or any other field that seeks a better understanding of our existence.

Overachievers Student Grant - \$15,000 - 1 Award (Deadline: December 15, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be in middle school or high school.
- B) Be a person who is making a difference in others' lives outside of the classroom.

Common App Scholarship - \$2,000 - 3 Awards (Deadline: December 31, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be in Grade 11 or Grade 12.
- B) Have achieved a GPA of 2.5 or greater during their last academic year.

Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Scholarship - \$10,000 – 15 Awards (Deadline: Dec. 31, 2022)

To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be an Eagle Scout between the ages of 13-18.
- B) Compete at the local Chapter level prior to competing at the National level.

Southeast Missouri State's prestigious President's Scholarship.

The Southeast Missouri State Prestigious Presidential Scholarship is awarded annually to five students who represent the top applicants to Southeast. The award starts at \$10,000 for the first year and grows as they renew it for an award total of \$43,000 over four years.

Eligibility: Students with a 3.9 high school GPA with no ACT or SAT score or a 3.75 high school GPA with a 31 ACT/1390 SAT are eligible to apply.

How to Apply: The process is pretty easy:

Step 1: Apply for admission to Southeast Missouri State University

Step 2: Complete the President's Scholarship Application

Select applicants will be invited to interview for the scholarship in the spring. Those who are invited to interview but are not selected will automatically receive a one-time \$1,500 study abroad stipend in addition to their Copper Dome and Residence Life Leadership awards. **Deadline: December 1, 2022**
